

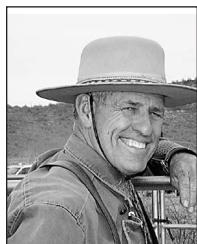

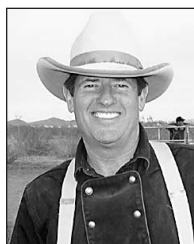


Jim Rodgers Chairman of the Board

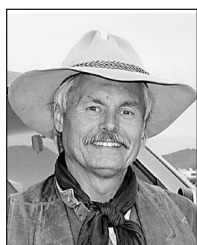

LeeAnn Sharpe, Secretary/Treasurer/Editor

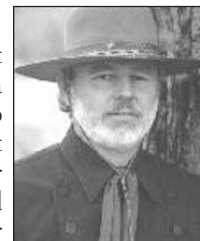

CMSA FUTURITY PROGRAM BUILDING THE FUTURE!

HORSES:

- Two Horse Divisions: Class 1— 3 and 4 year old Horses, Class 2—5 and Over

ELIGIBILITY:

- Horse not to have competed in CMSA WPQ competition prior to the 2002 Nationals in St. Louis, MO.
- Horse to be nominated by May 30th 2002. Nominated horse may be shown in club matches, time only rides, and practices prior to Nationals.
- After the Nationals, horse may be shown in any WPG competition to season for Futurity Finals at the World Championships in November 2002.
- Nominated horses do not have to be shown at the Nationals.
- Nominated horse must be in owners name. Trainer may ride horse in competition.
- Riders may ride a maximum of two horses. Owners may own more than two nominated horses.
- Owners and riders must be members of CMSA in good standing.
- CMSA Board will govern Futurity Committee
- All other CMSA rules to govern.

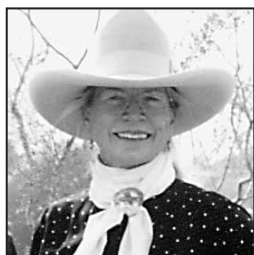
FEE SCHEDULE:

- \$100 Nomination fee due May 30th, 2002
- \$25 due and payable on July 1st, August 1st, September 1st, October 1st, November 1st (total \$125)
- Late nominations are double and missed payments to be double to continue eligibility.
- Horses may transfer ownership and compete in their division if payments are current.
- Horses may be reinstated with double missed payments.
- Substitution of horse will be allowed with a death certificate from a veterinarian plus a \$50 fee.
- Initial nomination must be accompanied with copy of registration papers or current Coggins and four photos (one of each side showing leg and face markings, one front and one back). If nominated horse is unregistered, a vet certificate must be included verifying age.

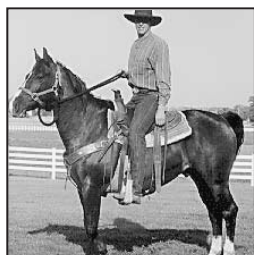
COMPETITION AND PURSE:

- Horses will compete in two stages only. There are no class divisions other than those stated above.
- Stages and alternate to be drawn prior to competition and horses will have access to competition arena.
- Minimum payout at Nationals: 1st place \$500, 2nd place \$300, 3rd place \$200, 4th place \$100
- Sponsors will add monies and merchandise to these purses. 100% of funds raised this year will be designated as used in Futurity - 20% hold back in future years
- Sheets will be awarded to class winners.

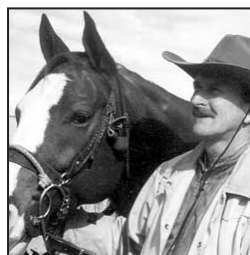

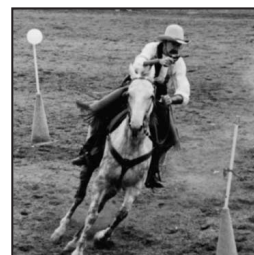

2001 NATIONAL WINNERS



Payson Peterson - 2001 Overall & Champion Cowboy

Payson Peterson, 2001 Overall and Champion Cowboy

Payson Peterson partnered with Chicote, (whip in Spanish) a strong, fast and sure-footed Appaloosa gelding, took the World Championship title in 1998 and the 2001 National Championship Overall and Cowboy title! They stayed focused and worked hard in their quest for excellence and the applause of everyone in the sport. Can they do it again this year at the Taylor's & Co. 11th Annual CMSA National Championships held in Lake St. Louis, Missouri at the America's Exposition Park Arena?

"I rode my Champion Shooting Horse Plaudit's Joker II, the registered Appaloosa. He goes by other names like Chicote and The Excellent Dude. He is 19 now and keeps getting better. He gives me everything he has on each run and comes off the rundown barrel so hard it still it makes me want to grin!" said Payson "I have been very blessed that God gave me such a great horse to play this game on." This good Appaloosa also carried Bruce Boxleitner and Buck Taylor to first and second place finishes respectively at the Festival of the West Celebrity shoot in 2001.

When asked if he did anything different this year in preparation for the National Championships, Payson said, "I did not prepare anything special for this shoot, I just try to make each run the best my horse and I can do and not try to beat anyone else or run the way they do. You have to shoot and ride your own style and for me that is to help my horse every chance I can and set up the run so he can make a smooth run which works best for him and I. He was running so well, I just tried to hold up my end and shoot the balloons one at a time. One thing I tried to stay conscience of on each run was to watch each balloon pop before looking at the next one. I did not want to let my horse down by hurrying too much and missing a balloon or tipping a barrel." Good advice for every shooter.

Anything more you would like to say Payson? "I would like to thank everyone for their hard work to put on the Nationals and it was so much fun shooting with everyone that weekend! I feel that I win when I enter a CMSA shoot, no matter how the scores come out in the end, because of the quality of people involved with the sport! It is great to meet new friends and to get reacquainted with others at any CMSA event!

Payson's alias has been Pecos Pete. After working cattle and horse ranches throughout the country Pecos Pete came up from Texas with a herd of horses on the Goodnight-Loving Trail to Colorado and settled in the near the Arkansas River in southern Colorado. In his younger days he traveled with Wild West Shows entertaining throughout the country for a spell. Alias of Pecos Pete came from an incident in a theater in Pecos, Texas that involved bullwhips, an unannounced act and an irate stage manager.

Payson has also taken on the added responsibility of working with Tom Jones on the CMSA Rifle Mounted Shooting Committee. He has written articles for the CMSA Rundown for those interested in Rifle Competition and will assist in running the Marlin Rifle Match at the Nationals this year.

Jennifer Sanderson 2001 Champion Cowgirl

Jennifer Sanderson, 2001 National Champion Cowgirl, rode hard to victory on Fancy, the mare her husband Brandon gave to her a little less than a year before. It was a tearful victory the first match she rode Fancy at Old Tucson Studios in 2000 and a heartfelt thank you to her husband for giving up the horse that had served him so well. Jennifer has proven her ability time and again. She often leads the ladies and has taken overall in matches more than once.

Jennifer said Fancy has been a tough horse to handle on occasion. "She has to be pushed all of the time and doesn't always want to go." At the Congress, AZ shoot September 2000, Jennifer was trying out other horses and Fancy was giving her so much trouble she went so far as to roll over her on the rundown barrel. Jennifer showed how tough she is by getting back on and riding her the rest of the match.

Any trouble she was having with her horse wasn't slowing her down as she won the Arizona State Championship, the Arizona State Points race, and took Reserve in the 2000 World Points Cowgirl race.

At Winter Range in February 2001, Jennifer took Reserve right behind Audrey Hensley. She has definitely made her mark as a National Champion Cowgirl!

As the mother of two boys, Tyler and Josh, she has her hands full already. Family is the number one priority in this cowgirl's life as is evidenced by the strong family support at each and every match. Her family has been recognized for their outstanding support of cowboy mounted shooting through their volunteer efforts. For the Sanderson clan, mounted shooting is a family affair!

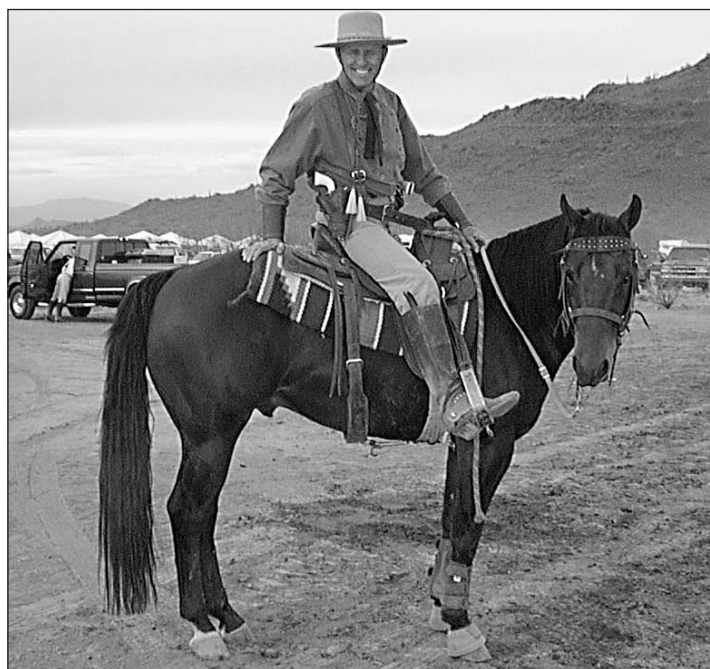
With work and school schedules, it's unlikely Jennifer will be able to attend the 2002 Nationals.

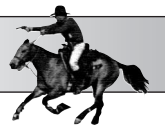

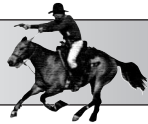

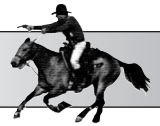
